WHAT IT IS

A two-day immersion at Eagle Haven Ranch in the heart of Florida, where you will experience firsthand how a healthy economy is inextricably tied to the health of the ecosystems that sustain it. The program pairs guided time on the ranch, its wildlife, water, and working lands, with candid conversation and hands-on learning about the funding models and partnerships making this kind of stewardship possible.

WHY VISIT

Eagle Haven lies within the Florida Wildlife Corridor, an 18-million-acre connected landscape running from the Panhandle toward the state's southern tip. It's home to 38 federally listed species and more than 160 state-listed threatened and endangered species. The region's marshes, wetlands, and swamps are natural infrastructure. They filter water and sustain the Kissimmee River, an essential lifeline for the greater Everglades, for millions of Floridians, and for the farms and businesses that depend on it.

LIVE WILDLY

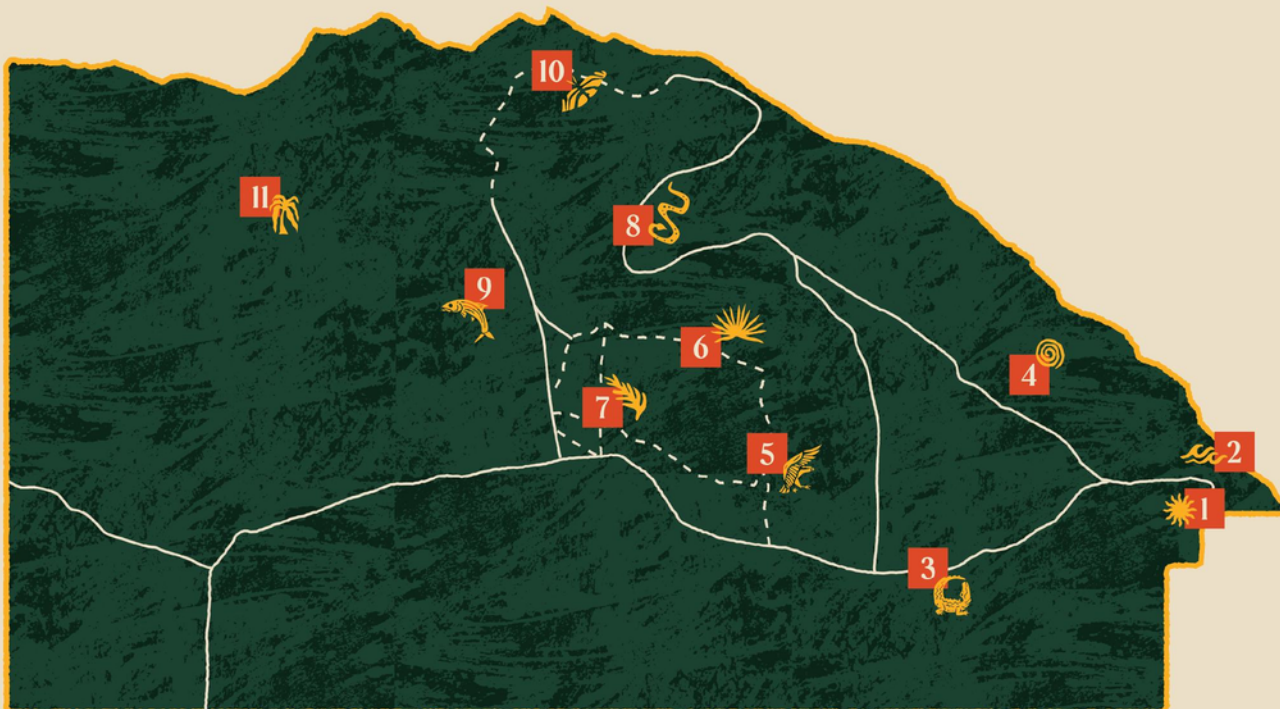
This land was nearly lost. Plans were drawn for a resort complete with restaurants and a golf course that would have paved over important wildlife habitat and a water source Floridians rely on.

Instead, private capital intervened.

Live Wildly benefactor Arnie Bellini acquired the land, and today Eagle Haven demonstrates what a proactive, well-structured conservation investment prevents, and what it can build in its place: a landscape that works for wildlife, for water security, and for the regional economy at the same time.
